



# FOG (Fats, Oils, and Grease) Survey

## Background

Castro Valley Sanitary District (CVSan) is responsible for two main things in Castro Valley; solid waste collection, disposal, and diversion; and maintaining the sanitary sewer system. In order to keep the sanitary sewer system healthy, it is important to understand what should not be poured down the drain. Fats, Oils, and Grease (FOG), is used and produced in food preparation. FOG can affect the sanitary sewer system by clogging sewer lines which could lead to sewer system overflows.

Castro Valley Green Ribbon schools do a great job practicing the 4Rs (reduce, reuse, recycle, and rot). FOG can be collected and recycled in the green organics cart along with food scraps, food soiled paper, and yard trimmings. Go to [www.cvsan.org/FOG](http://www.cvsan.org/FOG) for more information.

**How to Properly Dispose of FOG:**

Collect small amounts of FOG in a compostable container (paper milk or ice cream carton) and dispose of FOG in your green organics cart. You can toss the compostable container holding the FOG into your green organics cart.

Or use a small reusable container to capture FOG. It's best to pour FOG on top of leaves, grass clippings, or other yard trimmings. Thank you for keeping Castro Valley sanitary sewers clean!
